English- Elf for Hire! (3.W.6.1)

Persuasive writing

Students will be writing persuasive essays to convince Santa Claus to hire them as elves to help out at Christmas. A **persuasive essay**, also known as an **argumentative essay**, is a piece of academic writing where you use logic and reason to show that your point of view is more legitimate than any other. You must expose clear arguments and support them by convincing facts and logical reasons.



Reading

We will be using the Indiana Department of Education Comprehensive ELA Curriculum for High Ability and elements from our Pearson MyView Reading Program. This week we will continue

reading <u>Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone</u> By: J.K. Rowling. We will be discussing fact and opinion, inferring and making predictions, retelling by summary, and figurative language.

Make Predictions about Chapter 17

Science- Earth Science: Rocks and Minerals

Minerals are pure substances found in nature. Minerals can be grouped using their properties. Most rocks are made of two or more kinds of minerals that have become stuck together. There are many different kinds of rocks. One way we can classify them is by how they were formed. We'll be using lessons in Study Island along with our Pearson Interactive Science books, leveled readers, and a hands on rock and minerals identification lab. (Indiana Standards-3.ESS.3 Observe the detailed characteristics of rocks and minerals. Identify and classify rocks as being composed of different combinations of minerals.)

Social Studies- Geography & the Midwest Region



We will continue learning about maps, directions, and geography. We'll be using Study Island, Google Maps, and a variety of paper maps, globes, and online resources. This week we will focus on identifying the states that make up the midwest region of the United States.
