English: Contractions

This week's grammar skill is over Contractions. A **contraction** is a word or phrase that has been shortened by dropping one or more letters. In writing, an apostrophe is used to indicate the place of the missing letters. Students will identify and use contractions correctly. There will be a **grammar quiz** over **Contractions** on **Thursday**. (IN Standards: 3.RF.4.6 Read multi-syllabic words composed of roots and related prefixes and suffixes; read irregular contractions)

Science- Life Science

This week we will continue learning about life science. All animals have adapted to have special structures that help them survive. These adaptations are ways that the animal can find food, find shelter, survive certain weather conditions, or protect themselves. This week students will research an animal and its habitat. Students will create a poster of the animal and habitat to present to the class on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. (IN Standards 4.LS.3)



Social Studies- Geography & Physical Systems

We will continue learning about maps, directions, and geography. We'll be using Study Island, Google Maps, and a variety of paper maps, globes, and online resources. This week we will focus on identifying regions of the United States on a map and discussing how climate and geography affect culture.
