## Reading

We will be using the Indiana Department of Education Comprehensive ELA Curriculum for High Ability along with the Jacob's Ladder Reading Comprehension Program and elements from our Pearson MyView Reading Program. We will be using Bloom's Taxonomy to generate higher level responses to open ended questions.
This week we will focus on text6 analysis using the shared inquiry method of learning Students will be reading a variety of Folklore, Tall Tales, Legends, Myths, and Fairy Tales.

| Rules for Plural Nouns |
| :---: |
| Most nouns add $s$ to form plural |
| Nouns that end with $\underline{\operatorname{sh}}, \underline{\mathrm{ch}}, \underline{\mathrm{x}}, \underline{\mathrm{z}}$, or $\underline{s}$ add es |
| Nouns end with $\underline{\text { vowel }+\boldsymbol{y}, \text { add } s}$ |
| Nouns end with consonant $+\underline{y}$, change y to i and add es |
| Nouns that end with $\underline{f}$ or $\underline{\mathrm{fe}}$, change f or fe to ves |
| Nouns end with $\underline{\text { vowel }+\mathrm{o}}$, add s |
| Nouns end with $\underline{\text { consonant }+\mathrm{o}}$, add es |

English: Singular and Plural Nouns This week's grammar skill is over singular and plural nouns. Students will identify and use singular and plural nouns correctly. There will be a grammar quiz over nouns on Friday. (IN Standards: 3.W.6.1 Demonstrate command of English grammar and usage, focusing on: 3.W.6.1a Nouns/Pronouns - Writing sentences using abstract nouns.)

## Science- Life Science

This week we will continue learning about life science. Living things have stages in life or life cycles. We will look at a variety of animal, insect, and plant life cycles. Students will examine how these life cycles are the same and different. We'll be using lessons from our Pearson Realize Science book and lessons in Study Island along with online resources. There will be an open book Quiz in Pearson Science over
Lesson 3 - Life Cycles on Friday. (IN Standards:3.LS. 1 Analyze evidence that plants and animals have traits inherited from parents and that variation of these traits exists in a group of similar organisms.)

## Social Studies- Map Skills

We will continue learning about maps, directions, and geography. We'll be using Study Island, Google Maps, and a variety of paper maps, globes, and online resources. This week we will focus on the hemispheres and reading different types of maps. There will be an open notes Quiz identifying the hemispheres and basic map skills in Study Island on Thursday.
