

Generate a draft by developing, selecting and organizing ideas relevant to topic, purpose, and genre; revise to improve writing, using appropriate reference materials (e.g., quality of ideas, organization, sentence fluency, word choice); and edit writing for format and conventions (e.g., spelling, capitalization, usage, punctuation).

Students will be gathering information from 2 or more sources and combining that information to persuade their readers to visit another state. Students will practice citing the sources of their information. Students will use facts from state tourism websites and encyclopedias to gather information. Students will type their final



essay using Google Docs and then create a tourism poster that will help them to convince their readers that their state is the best choice for a vacation.

Reading

We will be using the Indiana Department of Education Comprehensive ELA Curriculum for High Ability, elements from our Pearson MyView Reading Program, and Junior Great Books.

This week we will continue reading the novel <u>Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief</u> by Rick Riordan. Along with this novel, we will be doing a study of Greek Mythology. This week students will begin to research a god, goddess, Character or monster from Greek Mythology. Students will organize this information to create a slideshow presentation. We will also be using Study Island for Quizzes over 3rd grade ELA skills. (Indiana Standards- 3.W.5, 3.RL.2.3, 3.RL.2.4, 3.RL.2.3, 3.RL.2.3, 3.RV.2.1, 3.RV.2.2, 3.W.4)




Science- Life Science: Basic Needs of Plants

To live and grow, plants need air, light, water, and nutrients. When one of these basic needs is not met, the plant cannot survive. Plants make their own food from light they get from the Sun. Most plants do not need to take in food. Plants need air. They use the air to help make food. Plants need nutrients in order to grow. Plants can get some of these from minerals in the ground. Plants must have water because it is needed to make food. There will be a **Quiz in Study Island over this topic next week**. (Indiana Standards-3.LS.2 Plan and conduct an investigation to determine the basic needs of plants to grow, develop, and reproduce.)



Social Studies- History: Fact & Fiction

Fact (also called **nonfiction**) is when people or stories are real. Real stories from long ago are called historical accounts. Real people from long ago are called historical figures. **Fiction** is when people or stories are not real. The people in these stories are called fictional characters. The stories can still be fun to read. They can also teach us about important traits like honesty and courage. We will be watching some short videos of American folktale heroes and analyzing fact from fiction. There will be a **Quiz in Study Island over this topic on Friday**.
